
Executive Summary

- Collaborated with other Ratepayer groups in discussions with developer putting in an application to develop the Dixie Mall site.
- Spoke with developer Light Point who propose an 17-20storey rental building on the former Planet Organic site.
- Participated in the Region of Peel 2041+ Official Plan Review
- Attended the City of Mississauga's 2020 Official Plan Review
- Contributed to Councillor's weekly calls to discuss neighbourhood concerns during COVID restrictions.







- Raised the issue of an 11,500 square foot house being proposed for a key location on Cumberland Road.
- Brought our concerns about the province NOT funding the marina project to MPP Rudy Cuzzetto and will continue to work with the Councillor to pursue the funding needed to preserve this business, these jobs, and the spend it brings to our main street corridor.
- Provided input on the City's new, 2-phase noise by-law.
- Shared comments and concerns related to the City's proposed Short-Term Accommodation (Air BnB) bylaws.
- Worked with the City and our BIA to expand our bicycle planter program to include 3 new locations.



- We have brought in a number of our members to attend virtual meetings presented by FRAM and by Edenshaw regarding development surrounding the Port Credit GO train station.
- Coordinated teams to help remove invasive plant species around the Adamson Estate.

We have worked hard to share updates on key issues with our membership, providing them with opportunities to get directly involved, or simply remain in the loop on issues that impact Port Credit.





In addition to the headshots, we also interviewed all 24 participating businesses to hear their individual experiences. We will be sharing each story on our socials over the following weeks.









