# Position Available: City Builder Extraordinaire Hear from the Candidates Running for Mayor of Mississauga 

Wednesday, March 13, 2024 (Mississauga, Ontario): On Monday, May 6 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ the doors of Port Credit's historic Clarke Memorial Hall will open at $6: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ to welcome residents from across the city in order to "interview" the growing list of candidates vying for Mississauga's top job.

Stepping away from the standard debate format used in past elections, organizers are aiming for an efficient, informative format, allowing candidates to tackle the tough issues and answer multiple questions while maintaining civility and staying on topic. Further, "It recognizes that some candidates may continue to work with one another post-election. Therefore, the need to remain collegial during the campaign process, is important," states TOPCA director, Richard Collins.
